National Service Scheme (NSS)

-Not Me But You-

At Invertis University, Bareilly, we are committed to providing our NSS (National Service Scheme) volunteers and Program Officers with the resources and facilities necessary to maximize their impact in community service. Here are the facilities available at Invertis University to support NSS activities effectively:

1. Dedicated NSS Office:

- Purpose-Built Space: The NSS office at Invertis University serves as a dedicated center for coordinating all NSS-related functions. This space is designed for team discussions, event planning, and strategic meetings. It ensures that the NSS unit operates with focus and structure.
